Pat Lewis, our auditor, presented the Audit Report for the period March 1, 2019 (the day after our last audit), to August 31, 2019 (end of our fiscal year). She concluded that all government forms have been filed, and the financial records of the Southwood Homeowners Association have been examined and found to be correct.

### Flu Shot: Your Best Bet for Avoiding Influenza

Reviews of past studies have found that, on average, the flu vaccine is about 50% to 60% effective for healthy adults who are between 18 and 64 years old.

Even when the vaccine doesn't completely prevent the flu, it may lessen the severity of your illness and the risk of serious complications. The flu vaccine is your best defense against the flu, but there are additional steps you can take to help protect yourself from the flu and other viruses. These steps include the following:

- Wash your hands often and thoroughly with soap and water
- Use an alcohol-based sanitizer on your hands if soap and water aren't available
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, or mouth whenever possible
- Practice good health habits get plenty of sleep, exercise regularly, drink plenty of fluids, eat a nutritious diet, and manage your stress

Rain barrels capture water from a roof and hold it for later use such as on lawns, gardens, or indoor plants. Collecting roof runoff in rain barrels reduces the amount of water that flows from your property (United States Environmental Protection Agency). It's a great way to conserve water and collect free water to use in your landscape!

# Torrance Refinery MHF Update

Remember the explosion at what was then the ExxonMobil Refinery in February 2015 where ashes fell from the sky? The explosion blew a 40-ton chunk of metal into the air that landed only 5 feet from tanks containing modified hydrofluoric acid (MHF).

Researchers at the South Coast Air Quality Management District (SCAQMD) have found that MHF is not significantly different from its very toxic predecessor, HF, which if released, can form a groundhugging cloud that may drift for miles causing death and injury. MHF is used at just two refineries in California – the Torrance Refinery and the Wilmington Valero Refinery.

The SCAQMD had been considering a rule to require a phase out over several years, or an increase in safety measures. But on September 6, the SCAQMD Governing Board decided to drop the rule-making process in exchange for the refineries implementing a series of voluntary safety measures.
