A Message from Your Southwood President

I know it's only October, but the holidays are around the corner and I thought it would be helpful to review some tips on how to keep your house safe while you are away. I reached out to the Torrance Police Department Community Affairs Division. They promptly emailed a couple of very helpful handouts. The handouts are posted on our "Southwood Torrance Homeowners Association" Facebook page, so please check them out! There are particularly good details on how to secure many different kinds of doors and windows. Here are a few tips from the handouts:

- Besides stopping regular deliveries of mail and newspapers, it is best to have someone regularly pick up advertising circulars or other flyers (including the Southwood Newsletter \odot).
- According to statistics, a large number of property theft and residential • burglaries occur because a garage door is left open and unattended.
- Don't leave door keys hiding anywhere obvious. Many insurance companies will not honor claims unless there has been a forced entry.
- One of the best deterrents to crime is you the neighbor. Write down • descriptions of suspicious persons. Write down the license numbers of suspicious vehicles. Then call the police (non-emergency number 310-328-3456) - "That's what we're here for."
- The best possible location for exterior lights is under the eaves to • illuminate the walls and expose anyone next to the home.
- Doorknob locks offer no security. Violating a doorknob lock is one of • the two most common means of forced entry. All exterior doors should have a deadbolt lock mounted in a solid-core door.

City Treasurer Recall

Many of you may already be aware there is a petition being circulated for a recall election of the Torrance City Treasurer, Dana Cortez. For more information, including signing the recall petition, please visit the website www.curedc.online or call 310-346-7425. Briefly, Dana Cortez has not reported to work since October 2018, shortly after she was stripped of half her duties and half her pay following allegations of mismanagement. She has provided doctor's notes citing unresolved medical issues. The deadline for the close to 13,000 signatures required is October 21, 2019.

City Charter Changes



On August 27, 2019, the City Council discussed bringing Charter changes to public vote. The proposed changes include:

- Changing the City Clerk and City Treasurer from elected to appointed positions
- Extending the time period from 30 days to 60 days for appointing a replacement to fill a vacancy in an elected position

Do **not** include:



- Liquids, napkins, tissue paper (Kleenex), and anything soiled with food
- Photographs and blueprint, carbon, or NCR paper
- Small Styrofoam pieces (called popcorn or peanuts) or any plastic bottle, bag, or container without a number in the triangle
- Glass dishes, light bulbs, mirrors, ceramic cups, drinking glasses, plates, porcelain, or window glass
- Pots or pans, propane or helium tanks, or scrap metal from plumbing or construction materials

Torrance Board of Education Observer Report

At the meeting of the Board of Education on September 3, 2019, the Board approved the following motions regarding activities and construction work:

- That the District enter into an agreement with Tilly's Life Center to provide lessons from the "I AM ME" curriculum, to be implemented from September 4, 2019, through January 31, 2021, at West High School, for a total cost not to exceed \$15,000. With rising mental health concerns on campus, West High has been looking into possible Social Emotional Learning (SEL) programs to offer students on campus. Through SEL, students learn skills in the areas of self-awareness, self-management, responsible decision-making, relationship skills, and social awareness.
- That the District accept bids for flooring and draining projects, and the completion of modernization at Anza elementary.

The Torrance Unified School District Board of Education meets twice monthly. Meetings begin at 7 p.m. and are open to the public. The board room is located in the Education Materials Building (EMB) at 2336 Plaza Del Amo.

Board of Education agendas are available for study at all school sites, city libraries, and on the <u>tusd.org</u> website. Additional information on agenda items is available on the website.

The meetings are cablecast live on Spectrum Channel 30 and Verizon Channel 37. Board of Education meetings will rerun Tuesdays and Wednesdays at 7 p.m., and Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays at 9 a.m., 2 p.m., and 7 p.m. starting the day after the live broadcast until the next meeting.

Torrance council voted 6-1 to adopt a \$70,000 annual coyote trapping program. Trapping will begin in October and the population culled to a manageable level. Residents still need to remain vigilant and follow the city's original <u>2016</u> <u>Coyote Management Plan</u> which can be found on the City of Torrance website, <u>www.torranceca.gov</u>.
