Assemblyman Muratsuchi Town Hall Recap

On Saturday, September 7, Assemblymember Al Muratsuchi held a Town Hall in the Torrance Council Chambers. He reviewed three areas of concern for our community – prioritizing our educational system, homelessness, and crime.

As the Chair of the State Assembly's Education Committee, Muratsuchi's goal is to protect K-12 education funding. Muratsuchi co-authored bill AB247 which is now Proposition 2 on the November ballot to create a 10 billion statewide bond funded by the state general fund, not by extra taxes. The bond would fund much needed renovations to K-12 schools and community colleges.

Concerning the increasing numbers of unhoused people in our city and state, Muratsuchi stated the number one cause is the cost of housing. While the state is pushing for more housing to be built, he does not agree with the state's recent legislation to force statewide zoning laws (i.e. SB 9) and is in favor of cities' retaining local control.

Muratsuchi is a former prosecutor who did not support Prop 47 in 2014. This year, he is endorsing Proposition 36 to hold repeat offenders accountable. A third theft crime would be charged as a felony.

One of the more contentious issues at the meeting was Muratsuchi's introduction of bill AB 1825 – the California Freedom to Read Act which prohibits public libraries from banning books because of the topic or content unless it qualifies as "obscene". The bill would require every public library jurisdiction to create a publicly accessible collection development policy which would include a process for community members to share their concerns.

Anza Repave Update

Anza Ave. from Del Amo Blvd. to Sepulveda Blvd. is currently being repaved. In Spring 2025, Anza Ave. will be repaved from Sepulveda Blvd. to PCH.

This project is not just about resurfacing the roads. Other scheduled maintenance includes addressing issues like ponding, tree replacement, and curb and gutter repairs.

In addition, the traffic signals from Del Amo Blvd. down to Carson St. have been upgraded. For example, upgrades include new video detection systems, safety lighting, pedestrian push buttons, installing emergency vehicle preemption systems, and new street name signs.

Torrance Adds New Friendship City

Back in January 2024, Councilmember Jon Kaji proposed initiating the friendship city process with two cities in Japan – Oshu, Iwate Prefecture and Bizen, Okayama Prefecture. These cities are the hometowns of recently signed Los Angeles Dodgers superstar players Shohei Ohtani and Yoshinobu Yamamoto respectively. On August 8, Torrance signed a Friendship City Agreement with the City of Bizen. The ceremony took place at Torrance City Hall with Torrance Mayor George K. Chen and Bizen Mayor Takeshi Yoshimura attending.

Through friendship city relationships, Torrance hopes to continue fostering the growing demand by the Dodger Japanese fanbase who visit Los Angeles and establish Torrance as a destination for baseball fans everywhere. This should bring increased sales tax revenue and strengthen Torrance's position in attracting additional sports teams and new investments in advance of the 2028 Summer Olympics. It will also potentially allow for Torrance Little League teams to establish relationships leading to youth baseball exchange programs.

Torrance has one sister city, Kashiwa Chiba Prefecture Japan. Sister city relationships require approval from both cities' respective city councils. Friendship city agreements can be made between mayors through a memorandum of understanding that endorses the link between the municipalities. Friendship city relationships can lead to sister city status.

Now, Torrance has four friendship cities: Hwaseong in South Korea, Changhua and Tainan in Taiwan, and Bizen in Japan. The friendship city effort with Oshu, Iwate Prefecture Japan, is still in progress.

- Introduced Dr. Stephanie Lewis as the new Adult School Director.


Torrance Annual Scaredown
