# **Torrance City Election June 7, 2022**

The Torrance City General Municipal Election is on Tuesday, June 7, 2022. City Council Candidates for District 1, 3 and 5 will only appear on the ballots of their respective districts. District 2 (includes Southwood), 4, and 6 were elected in March 2020. Following is the list of candidates:

In addition to the election of Torrance City Officials listed above, there is also a half-cent city sales tax increase measure on the ballot. The half-cent sales tax increase would provide an estimated additional \$18 million in annual revenue with all proceeds locally controlled by Torrance. If the measure does not pass, there would be significant spending cutbacks. \*It's interesting to note that our current City Treasurer, Dana Cortez, is running for re-election. As written in the Daily Breeze on May 20, 2021, "Current elected City Treasurer Dana Cortez makes roughly \$65,000 a year, even though her duties have been cut back since she mostly stopped reporting for work in 2018. Since then, Cortez has taken numerous leaves of absence and is currently working from home. Her only responsibility, according to city officials, is signing off on budget documents."

## **Torrance's First Citywide Report**

On March 1, the City of Torrance proudly released its inaugural citywide report, a 2021 Year in Review. The City Manager's Office, in collaboration with staff from each of the 13 City departments, produced the report to communicate with the City Council and members of the public a highlight of projects across all departments for the 2021 calendar year. Mayor Furey was impressed with the visually inviting report and added, "I believe it provides a picture of how City staff takes pride in this community and works hard to make Torrance a wonderful place to live and do business."

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#### **Torrance School District News**

#### **Covid-19 Updates:**

Indoor masking mandates for all K-12 schools and child care facilities will end as of March 12, 2022, regardless of vaccination status. Over the course of the pandemic, TUSD followed State and County Health Orders and guidelines to ensure that in-person instruction took place in the safest environment possible. With this change in masking policy, indoor masking is optional starting Monday, March 14; thus students will no longer be required to wear masks while on campus.

Mask wearing is still strongly recommended by the State and County Health Departments and is an option for every student or staff member who wishes to wear one at any time. Masks will still be provided by the District.

#### **Secondary School Start Times Changes:**

CA Senate Bill #328, signed into law October 13, 2019, required a change in secondary school start times by July 1, 2022. The TUSD Start Time Change Committee recommended the following changes that will be in effect starting fall 2022:

## **SB9 Implementation in Torrance**

In December 2021, the Torrance Community Development Department presented a slideshow to the City Council and residents that depicted the implementation of SB9 in the R-1 Zone. Staff explained that beginning in 2022, SB9 allows lots to be split to a minimum 1,200 sq. feet, and 2 units (homes) constructed on that lot, each one allowed to be at least 800 square feet, for a total of 4 units. If the homes are located within ½ mile of a bus stop, no parking area is required for the new construction.

In response, the Torrance Community Development Department prepared an Ordinance that included development standards for two-unit projects and urban lot splits allowed by SB9 to ensure there is no interruption of local regulatory authority. Those development standards dictate the maximum size of a new unit is 800 square feet; that it must have an unenclosed parking space onsite; that the maximum building height is 16 feet; and that the new home may only be one story. The City Council voted to adopt the Ordinance, thus implementing local development standards for two-unit projects and urban lot splits allowed by SB9.
